Holy Week: do consider coming to some or all of the Holy week services across the Benefice. There are leaflets at the back detailing the services. Journeying through the events of Holy Week allows us to enter into the mystery of all that Christ has done for us and deepens our appreciation of Easter. In particular, at 7pm on Maundy Thursday when we remember the last supper and Jesus' agony in the garden and on Good Friday there is silence and readings between 12noon -2pm – come and go as you wish, and then at 2pm the Good Friday liturgy where stand together before the cross of Jesus.

Easter Day: during Lent we do not sing the Gloria so it is traditional to ring bells and make a big noise on Easter Sunday, in rejoicing. Do bring bells or any other kind of noisy instrument to play during the Gloria on Easter Day.

Easter Flowers: we are planning the floral decoration of the church for Easter. If you wish to join us on the morning of Saturday 20th April from 09.00 to 11.30 you will be most welcome.
